

INTERNATIONAL WARM-UP RING

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

The Spruce Meadows Tournaments will be conducted according to the current rules of Equestrian Canada, the FEI and the Organizing Committee of Spruce Meadows.

In entering Tournaments at Spruce Meadows, you and your team have agreed to honour the General Information as specified in this Schedule and on the entry form. Your agreement and acceptance of all rules, regulations and Spruce Meadows decisions is indicated by competing at our Tournament. If the competitor is a minor, it shall be understood that the parent/ legal guardian will assume all responsibilities/liabilities of the competitor.

Note: If there is a conflict between the FEI Rules & Regulations and the Spruce Meadows General Information provided in this section, the laws of the land and the FEI Rules & Regulations take precedence.

The Spruce Meadows Summer Series consists of two tours. The North Star 1 comprises the 'Continental' and 'National', and the North Star 2 encompasses the 'Pan American' and 'North American'. Horses must enter either the North Star 1, North Star 2, or full circuit. Entries for one week or non-consecutive weeks will not be accepted at this time.

BIOSECURITY

The Spruce Meadows Executive and Organizing Committee, in consultation with veterinary and animal health authorities, have determined the protocol deemed necessary in order to reasonably and effectively manage the possible biosecurity concerns. It is STRONGLY recommended that you consult with your veterinarian regarding the most appropriate vaccination protocol for your horse.

All horses being brought onto the grounds shall not have been in contact with sick horses within the last 21 days, and must not be showing any signs of illness. All horses on the grounds are expected to have their temperatures taken and recorded regularly and twice daily for the 3 days preceeding arrival. Please have temperature records available upon request. Any elevated temperature or other signs of illness must IMMEDIATELY be reported to the FEI veterinary delegate or treatting veterinarian and the tournament office

Please avoid direct and/or indirect contact between horses, especially nose-to-nose contact and the use of common feed/

water buckets and individuals handling horses from different barn groups. Individuals should not be entering teh barn area of a different group. Please wash/sanitize your hands frequently throughout the day, especially after being in a communal area. Hand sanitizing stations are located throughout the property.

All horses must have their temperatures taken and recorded twice daily. while on the grounds. Any horse stabled in FEI must have their temperatures recorded via the FEI Horse Health App. This includes during the off week.

All individuals are asked to self-monitor. Anyone with an elevated temperature or exhibiting signs of illness may not come on to the grounds without first testing for COVID-19 and obtaining a negative result.

Regulations surrounding COVID-19 requirements or import regulations may change with little/no notice.

In the event of a biosecurity event, horses may be required to remain on property until official veterinarians/government officials deem it safe to clear them. The OC will not be liable for any additional fees/expenses in this situation.

The Spruce Meadows Executive and Organizing Committee, as well as the Veterinary Commission and government regulators, will closely monitor any developments regarding any potential biosecurity issues and will change the procedures and requirements for horses/humans entering the grounds as needed.

COGGINS, EQUINE INFLUENZA, & EHV

Competition horses must have a current negative coggins test (valid for 6 months from date drawn), equine influenza, and EHV vaccination (both valid for 6 months from the vaccination date but not within 7 days of arrival to the grounds), copies of which must be received by May 23. If an FEI horse does not have an EHV vaccination, their movement around the grounds will be severely restricted. The name on all documents must match the horse's name on entry form and passport/horse recording. Forms completed with horse's barn name will not be accepted. **Spruce Meadows must receive all health documents well in advance of horse arrival**.

TOURNAMENT OFFICE

The Tournament Office is open from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on non-tournament days, and from 45 minutes before the start of competition until 5pm on competition days. Staff is generally not available after hours without prior arrangement.

For your convenience the Tournament Office is now able to operate virtually in many regards with the addition of the Rider's Portal. Riders are able to start, order feed, view their account(s) and close out via the Portal. An access code will be sent to you when we have received everything we require for your entry (including but not limited to payment, signatures and vaccination information). Please email the Tournament Office if you would like someone else (e.g. trainer, barn manager) to have access to your portal. Staff are still happy to assist you in person during office hours.

PARKING

There will be designated parking areas on the grounds for competitors' vehicles and horse trailers. The accreditation issued



to you at the start of the Tournament will act as your parking pass. There is designated <u>RESERVED</u> RV parking. RVs cannot park anywhere other than the designated RV sites. Vehicles and trailers WILL BE TOWED if parked in unauthorized areas. If you are parking a horse trailer at Spruce Meadows, it must be registered at the Tournament Office and parked in the designated location to avoid being towed. Horse trailers are subject to a \$75 parking fee.

FEED AND BEDDING

Feed/bedding must be ordered from the Tournament Office before 11:00 A.M. for same day delivery. Orders received after 11:00 A.M. may not be delivered until the next day.

Spruce Meadows has many types of feed available for purchase —please check with the Tournament Office for a complete list of available products and prices. Feed and bedding can be preordered by email or through the Orders & Uploads button on the webiste. **Do not include feed orders on your entry form. Sameday orders are delivered last as pre-orders are given priority.** Feed and bedding orders are posted to the horse's account OR to a barn account. We are unable to split charges upon closing please order your supplies accordingly. If you purchase feed or bedding from an outside supplier and have it delivered to Spruce Meadows, or bring your own hay/bedding, additional charges will apply.

Discrepancies in deliveries will not be considered unless brought to the attention of the Tournament Office on the day of scheduled delivery.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES

Horses have the right of way at all times.

Individuals who do not have a valid driver's license allowing them to operate a motorized vehicle in the province/state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind on Spruce Meadows' property.

Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate a motorized vehicle as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from that operation. Anyone found to be operating a motor vehicle on property with more passengers than seats, or without a valid license will be fined.

Please note there is a 10 km/hr speed limit on the Tournament Grounds. Violations of these rules may result in the individual or group being fined, or asked to leave the Tournament Grounds and a forfeiture of Tournament Fees paid and prize monies won.

Golf carts are not available to rent through Spruce Meadows. Personal golf carts or those rented from a 3rd party are permitted.

SMOKING / VAPING / CANNABIS

There is a strict **NO SMOKING or VAPING** policy in all Spruce Meadows buildings, and within 10 feet of any entrance thereof. Competitors are responsible for the actions of all their staff, owners, trainers, etc. Any person caught smoking in a barn or building, or outside an entrance will be assessed a fine of \$250, applied to the horse's account. Further offences may result in being asked to leave the Tournament grounds and a forfeiture of Tournament fees paid. See FEI Article 1019.2 for FEI regulations. The use of cannabis (including but not limited to smoking) is STRICTLY PROHIBITED on the Spruce Meadows grounds.

PETS

All pets must be kept on a leash while on the grounds (FEI Article 109.14). This includes in the barns/stabling compound. Owners are required to clean up after their pets. A \$100 fine will be assessed to those failing to clean up after their animals.

Unleashed pets or those which become a nuisance (that run loose, are aggressive or vicious) anywhere on the grounds, will be taken by our security personnel to a safe area. Release may be obtained after payment of a \$200 fine. Pet owners are responsible for the competition fee(s) of the horse(s) whose performance may be disrupted by their animal. An associated horse account will be billed.

Pets that are aggressive, vicious, or are found by security multiple times, will be banned from the grounds.

WASH RACKS

Warm water wash racks are located north of "A" & "B" Barns. To avoid flooding please dispose of any manure deposited in the wash racks. A \$200 fine will be assessed to those who fail to clean up after themselves. Please only use the designated areas for washing your horses. Hoses are not permitted to be left running in the barn aisle.

MANURE DISPOSAL

Each horse will be assessed a manure disposal fee of \$58/horse/ week. If bedding is not purchased through Spruce Meadows (min 4 bags/horse/week), the fee is \$100/horse/week.

FARRIER

A farrier will be on call for each of the Tournament days for emergencies. Please obtain the phone number of the farrier on call from the North Meadows Tournament Office.

No farrier other than the official horse show farrier(s) will be permitted to work on the grounds without first being signed in and completing the paperwork at the Tournament Office. Personal farriers will NOT be issued FEI accreditation.Personal farriers and any hot shoeing are only permitted in the designated farrier location. Any person caught hot shoeing in a barn, other



building, or outside an entrance will be assessed a fine of \$500, applied to a horse account, and may be asked to leave the Tournament Grounds, and forfeit tournament fees paid as well as any prize money won. Acceptance in future Tournaments will be determined by the Organizing Committee.

LOST & FOUND

The Lost & Found is located in the North Meadows Tournament Office. Items not claimed within one week of the end of the Tournament will be donated. PLEASE KEEP A CLOSE WATCH ON YOUR BELONGINGS!

NATIONAL FEDERATION MEMBERSHIP

All competitors & owners must be members in good standing of their respective National Federation affiliated with the FEI.

All Canadian competitors and owners must have a valid individual sport license with Equestrian Canada.

AMERICAN COMPETITORS IN EC COMPETITIONS MUST HAVE AN EC NUMBER AND COMPLETE THE MANDATORY SAFE SPORT TRAINING (18+) BEFORE THEY ARE ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE

JUMP LEVY & PHOTOGRAPHY

A Jump Levy of \$20 will be applied to each horse's account for each Tournament week.

A photography fee of \$50 per horse per week will be applied to each horse's account each tournament week. Spruce Meadows is please to offer competitors high quality competition photos of each events. Competitors wishing to opt out of this service should indicate that on their entry form by the closing/definite date.

COMPLETION OF ENTRY FORM

Be sure your entry form is signed by the rider and person responsible. Juniors must have their parent/legal guardian sign. Person(s) responsible must be 18+ and attending the tournament. <u>Competitors will not be permitted to start until the entry form is signed.</u>

ENTRY FORM CHECK LIST:

- 1. Completed entry form including all requested informaiton, signatures and membership numbers.
- 2. <u>COPY OF VALID COGGINS TEST, EQUINE INFLUENZA</u> VACCINATION & EHV FOR EACH HORSE.
- 3. Birth dates for all Junior competitors.
- 4. A valid EC Horse Registration number for Canadian owned horses.
- 5. A current FEI passport number for any horse entered into the 5* division or accompanying horse
- 6. Persons responsible <u>MUST</u> be 18+ <u>AND</u> attending the tournament.. Under EC rules, the person responsible must be either the owner or rider for adult entries, or the trainer, owner, or parent/guardian if the competitor is a junior.

If your entry form is incomplete (including but not limited to membership numbers, horse/rider information, payment and signatures) your entry will be subject to a \$75 fee, may not be eligible for acceptance and/or late fees may apply.

PAYMENT

Payment **MUST ACCOMPANY ENTRIES IN ORDER** for them to be considered valid. Accepted forms of payment are credit card (VISA, MC, AMEX), cheque in Canadian funds, or wire transfer. All stabling, administration, and nomination fees are processed prior to arrival. \$1000 per week will be processed in late April with the balance taken in May. There is a \$10 service charge per horse for credit card payments.

DO NOT SEND CHEQUES DRAWN ON AN AMERICAN BANK ACCOUNT MARKED "PAYABLE IN CANADIAN FUNDS". American cheques for the U.S. Dollar equivalent of your entry fees are acceptable. Please call Spruce Meadows for the exchange rate. If you are planning to wire, please contact Spruce Meadows for the wiring instructions.

RETURNED CHEQUES/DECLINED CREDIT CARDS are subject to a \$100 NSF Fee - COMPETITORS ARE STRONGLY ENCOURAGED TO CONTACT THEIR CREDIT CARD COMPANY TO PRE-APPROVE PAYMENT. If payment is not included with the entry or multiple attemps are made unsuccessfully to secure payment, the entry will be treated as "late" and a \$600 late charge will be applied to the account. Spruce Meadows reserves the right to return the entry or prohibit from competition any rider/owner whose credit card is declined/cheque returned NSF on one or more occasions.

SPRUCE MEADOWS DOES NOT KEEP CREDIT CARDS ON FILE FROM PREVIOUS TOURNAMENTS. If paying by card, a valid credit card number with expiry date and cardholder signature MUST accompany each entry in order for it to be considered valid. Should you prefer to call in a credit card number, THE SIGNATURE BOX MUST STILL BE SIGNED. A credit card number must be received by the Tournament Office BY THE CLOSING DATE. Credit card numbers received after the closing date will result in the entry being deemed late and therefore late fees will be applied. Spruce Meadows will not call to obtain a credit card number

EQUESTRIAN CANADA NOMINATIONS

- To be accepted, a horse must be nominated for at least one division (over and above any clear round divisions) and pay the nomination fees for each week the horse is competing. The horse is eligible to compete as per the regulations set out in each section. Do NOT pay starting fees with your entry form.
- 2. Competitors have until the cut off each week to adjust their nominations. You will be charged a late fee, in addition to the nomination fee, for any new divisions added after this deadline and nomination fees will NOT be refunded if you decide not to compete AFTER this deadline.
- 3. Competitors may only adjust their nominations within 2 divisions (up or down) of what is indicated on the entry form.
- 4. Competitors are responsible for their own errors and those of their agents in the preparation of their entry forms.
- 5. If you wish to compete with your horse in multiple divisions (assuming eligibility), you should submit the nominating fees for all of the divisions with your entry form.

2024 GENERAL INFORMATION



- You may nominate as many horses as you wish, however you may only ride a maximum of two horses per competition each day (unless otherwise stated). Different horses can be ridden each day if you wish.
- 7. Horses entered in EC divisions are not eligible for FEI divisions at the same Tournament.
- 8. Non-competing horses are subject to a \$1100 flat fee (plus E barn stabling if applicable) per week. Vet notes must be presented to the Tournament Office by 4pm the day before competition begins to be considered for a reduction in fees.

STARTING (DECLARING) FOR COMPETITION

- 1. Horses must be started (declared) the day before the competition is held, at which time the starting fee is applied to your horse's account.
- 2. EC horses started after the specified closing time for declarations will be charged a double start fee, will go 1st in the order unless otherwise specified by the Tournament Office and are subject to approval by the Organizing Committee. Please refer to the Tournament Schedule posted in the Tournament Offices. No horse may be late started into a competition that has already begun.
- EC horses which have been started in a competition and are then withdrawn must be identified **prior to 8:00 am** on the day of the competition and a certificate of disability from a veterinarian or doctor must be submitted at least one hour prior to the start of the competition in order to receive a refund of the start fee.
- 4. If there are multiple competitions in the same division on the same day, the Organizing Committee reserves the right to numerically balance the events.
- 5. Horses jumping 1.20m or lower may start twice per day. All other horses may only start once per day.
- 6. Hors concours entries are not permitted.

SECOND RIDER

If you would like a second rider to ride your horse, please ensure that the person has filled out a WAIVER at the North Meadows Office and provided all current membership numbers prior to any competition. No rider will be allowed to enter a ring until this waiver is signed and memberships confirmed. Any entry found in violation of this will be eliminated and prize money revoked, and may be disqualified from the remainder of the tournament.

CLOSING DATE OF EC ENTRIES

 The date and time the Tournament Office receives the entry is final in determining whether it is received on time. When mailing, it is your responsibility to allow sufficient time for entries to reach the office by 5:00 PM. MST (Calgary Time) of the closing/definite date. Entries are NOT considered received if handed to any member of the Spruce Meadows staff at any location other than the Spruce Meadows Tournament Office. It is the responsibility of all Competitors/Owners/Agents to call 403-974-4516 and confirm that ALL of their submitted entries have been received in full and are legible. Spruce Meadows is unable to call to confirm receipt. A confirmation at your end does NOT guarantee it was received by Spruce Meadows. Failure to confirm receipt within 3 business days of sending your entries may result in entries being deemed late or unaccepted.

Anyone submitting an entry for one week or non-consecutive weeks will be wait-listed. Spruce Meadows will contact those on the wait list when and if the entry can be accepted.

Note: If it is necessary to limit entries, the entry deadline, date received, number of weeks attending and size of group will be taken into consideration in determining acceptance. The Organizing Committee's decisions are final and confidential.

LATE ENTRIES may be accepted from the closing date up to the Monday prior to the start of the Tournament, subject to the following conditions:

- approval of the Organizing Committee
- stabling availability
- number of entries already received
- payment of a late fee of \$600 CDN PER HORSE. (Entries will not be permitted to enter the competitive ring until this fee has been paid.)

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE OWNER, COMPETITOR, OR AGENT TO CALL THE TOURNAMENT OFFICE, 403.974.4516, AND ENSURE ANY WRITTEN NOTICE HAS BEEN RECEIVED.

***VETERINARIAN OR DOCTOR NOTES THAT:**

- are received after the cancellation;
- are improperly dated; or not signed

• are not on official Veterinarian/Doctor letterhead; ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE.

**The stall(s) reverts to Spruce Meadows for reassignment. You may not reallocate your stall yourself.

 Any refund of fees will be printed as a cheque, and mailed out after the end of the Tournament Series or at the rider's request, may be applied to the outstanding balance of a different horse entered in the tour.. COMPETITORS CANCELLING THEIR ENTRIES AFTER THE START OF THE TOURNAMENT, REGARDLESS OF THE REASON, WILL RECEIVE NO REFUND. Note: Competitors are asked to advise Officials at the Hitching Ring or one of the Tournament Offices immediately when they are scratching from a competition or from the remainder of the Tournament.

SUBSTITUTION OF ENTRY

After the closing date of entries and up to May 13, an entry may be substituted for a \$100 fee, provided that the stabling requirements, nominations and entry payment are all the same.

Any substitutions made after May 13 will be subject to a \$200 fee. Any substitutions done at the time of check in will be subject to a **\$400 substitution fee**. Proof of vaccinations, coggins and memberships must accompany all substitutions to be considered.

An entry may only be substituted if neither horse has competed at any week of the Summer Series, must replace the same type (i.e. National or FEI) of entry and will <u>replace the entry in its</u> <u>entirety</u>.

All substitutions are subject to approval from the Organizing Committee. Payments that have already been processed will not be refunded and it is up to the parties involved in the substitution to handle any billing requirements; a new form of payment may be used on close-out.

STABLING

Every effort is made to accommodate the requested stabling. Stall assignment is subject to many factors including demand, quarantine requirements, distance travelled, and size of barn. Priority will be given to those attending the full series. For these reasons, the OC reserves the right to adjust your stabling request—your horse's account will be adjusted accordingly.

Please note on your entry if you would prefer your horses together or separate (if applicable). FEI and accompanying EC horses may be able to stable together providing they meet all requirements. FEI stabling priority will be given those horses competing FEI and entered by the definite date(s). Stall assignments may shift during the circuit after the definite date(s).

Horses not staying for the full circuit MUST ARRIVE AND DEPART BY THE DATES AND TIMES LISTED—<u>NO EXCEPTIONS</u>. ALL HORSES STABLING IN FEI MUST BE CHECKED IN BY THE VET BEFORE ENTERING THE STABLING AREA. Please see FEI schedule for FEI arrival information.

Any stall fittings/tack/equipment, etc. left after check-out will be removed and placed in the LOST & FOUND.

ALL ARRIVALS MUST BE BETWEEN 9AM-5PM UNLESS PREVIOUS ARRANGEMENTS HAVE BEEN MADE WITH THE TOURNAMENT OFFICE.

Early/late arrivals and late departures MAY be accommodated. Extra charges will apply. Early arrivals may not be able to move directly into their competition stalls. Please contact the Tournament Office to request an alternative arrival time.

- Priority will be given to horse stalls, and as such extra stall assignment may be subject to distance travelled and length of stay. For these reasons, your extra stall(s) may have to be limited—your account will be adjusted accordingly. Please email before arrival to confirm the number of extra stalls.
- 2. Extra stalls are applied to the horse's account OR to a barn account. We are unable to split stalls onto multiple accounts —please order accordingly.
- 3. All stalls must be cleaned daily and refuse placed in the designated bins by 8:00 A.M.
- 4. Stabling will be assigned at the entry deadline based on the 'Stable With' box on the entry form and the Stall Request Form submitted. Changes made after the closing date may not be able to be accommodated. If you do not request stabling during the transition week, you do not get to keep the stall for the 2nd tour.
- 5. Do not block aisles or stall doors with decorations or tack trunks, structurally alter stalls in any way, or write on/deface stalls. Damaged caused to any stall, building, equipment, or other property by the rider or one of their employees/ associates will be billed accordingly to the horse's account.
- 6. Any electrical installations and connections must meet all municipal, provincial and government codes. DO NOT OVERWHELM THE CIRCUITS. Violations will be subject to fine, confiscation of equipment or breaker shut-down.



- 7. No motorized vehicles are permitted in the building. No class 1 flammable liquids are permitted in any barn. Violations of these rules will result in fines and/or being asked to leave the grounds and forfeiture of fees paid/prize monies won.
- 8. Cooking or any open flame is not permitted in any barn or within 10 feet of a barn door.
- 9. There are no permanent import quarantine stalls available at Spruce Meadows.
- 10. If your horse is coming in to Canada on temporary papers, this must be noted on your entry form and you must contact Spruce Meadows by May 1 to confirm availability. All horses on temporary import MUST be eligible to stable in FEI.
- 11. All stalls are matted.

ARRIVALS & DEPARTURES

- Horses should arrive between 9:00am 5:00pm Please contact the Tournament Office if you would like to arrive outside of the stated times. After hours arrivals are subject to a fee, billed to the horse's account.
- 2. All horses must have their temperatures taken and recorded upon arrival Temperature records for the 3 days preceeding arrival must be available upon request. All horses stabling in FEI must complete the FEI check in..
- 3. All arrivals must email the Tournament Office 36-48 hours prior to arrival with your ETA.
- 4. Due to space limitations, horses not competing for the tour are not able to be <u>accommodated on the grounds</u>. Other stabling in the area is usually available. Under no circumstances may a horse be placed in a stall to which it has not been assigned. <u>VIOLATION OF THIS RULE WILL RESULT IN A \$250 FINE TO THE HORSE'S ACCOUNT.</u> ANY CHANGES TO HORSE PLACEMENT WITHIN YOUR ASSIGNED AREA MUST BE APPROVED BY THE TOURNAMENT OFFICE. Competitors must not move from their assigned block of stalls without the permission of the Tournament Office.
- 5. Please note there are 3 "dark days" during the Summer Series when the Tournament Offices are closed:

MONDAY, JUNE 10 • MONDAY, JUNE 17 • FRIDAY JUNE 21

Staff are not available and feed/bedding will not be able to be ordered, picked up, or delivered on the above days. Please plan accordingly.

- 6. If your horse is in Canada on temporary papers, it is only allowed at the locations listed on the permit. Spruce Meadows is not responsible for fines/loss of entries if your horse if found in violation of this. No refund of fees is possible. You must inform Spruce Meadows by May 1 if your would like to apply for your horse to be in Canada on temporary papers.
- 7. Once on the grounds, horses cannot be taken off the grounds until after the completion of their final competition of the Tour and only then if the horse's account is closed (if warranted and feasible from the Organizing Committee's viewpoint, special permission may be obtained from the Tournament Secretary). Unauthorized removal will result in forfeiture of Tournament fees paid and prize money for all entries of the Owner, Trainer, Competitor, Grooms and group involved, and acceptance in future Tournaments will be determined by the Organizing Committee.

8. Vehicles will not be allowed into the stabling area from the evening prior to the FEI Jog, until one hour after the end of the last competition of the Tour. Vehicle access will be limited during the transition week. Please plan your departures accordingly. Horses and/or equipment may be walked out of the stabling area after the account(s) are closed and a release form has been obtained/passport collected.

ACCREDITATION

- 1. Spruce Meadows security accreditation is required for ALL riders and their support staff. Stabling security is an FEI requirement.
- 2. Spruce Meadows accreditation is required for access to the barn area, parking, and various other areas around the grounds.
- 3. Stable accreditation will be allotted as follows: Maximum of 2 owners per horse (as listed in the horse's passport), 1 groom per horse, and 1 guest or trainer per rider. Trainers must be listed on the entry form. Canadian trainers must be licensed coaches. Riders are required to sign in their accredited guests PRIOR to accreditation being issued. NO EXCEPTIONS. If the rider is a junior, the parent/legal guardian must sign.
- 4. No additional passes will be issued free of charge unless the discarded accreditation has been returned to the North Meadows Tournament Office; please plan accordingly and make sure only those vital to your operations are approved for a pass.
- 5. Additional limited access passes may be available to the rider for \$300, billed to the associated horse account.
- 6. As per FEI Veterinary Regulations (Article 1023), only those permitted treating veterinarians and permitted equine therapists with current FEI registration will be eligible to receive FEI accreditation. Those individuals must still be signed in by a rider and fill out the required paperwork PRIOR to security pass issuance.
- 7. EC veterinarians, therapists, and all personal farriers are required to be signed in by the respective rider and



the required paperwork must be filled out prior to any treatment. Failure to do this may lead to them being asked to leave the grounds. As all barns operate under FEI rules, this applies to ALL veterinarians/ therapists.

PRACTICE AREAS & SCHOOLING HOURS

- 1. Schooling is permitted in designated areas at designated times only. Stewards will be in attendance.
- 2. Schooling times, rules and locations are posted at the Tournament Offices. Practice areas are available for horses stabled on the grounds, commencing Monday of the Tournament week.
- 3. Lunging is only permitted in designated areas.
- 4. FEI Schooling Rules will be in effect at all times in all rings; including the transition week.

RAPPING

AT SPRUCE MEADOWS, RAPPING OF A HORSE IS NOT ALLOWED IN ANY WAY WHATSOEVER AT ANY TIME. VIOLATORS MAY BE DISQUALIFIED FROM THE TOURNAMENT AT THE DISCRETION OF THE GROUND JURY AND ALL PRIZE MONIES WILL BE FORFEITED. IN SUCH CASES, STARTING AND TOURNAMENT FEES WILL NOT BE REFUNDED. FEI ARTICLE 243 WILL APPLY.

TOURNAMENT ATTIRE

Spruce Meadows Tournament competition dress code requires traditional show jumping attire (FEI Article 256). Riders competing in the International, All Canada, and Meadows on the Green Rings are to wear white breeches. In the case of inclement weather, the Competitions Manager will make the call in regards to rain gear.

It is compulsory for all persons to wear a properly fastened protective headgear at all times when mounted (FEI Article 256.1.4). any time on the Spruce Meadows grounds

A maximum of one earphone/bud may be worn while mounted on a horse anywhere on the grounds.

TOURNAMENT AREA CONDUCT

- 1. No persons other than the Officials, Stewards, and Staff on duty may enter the competitive ring without the permission of the Competitions Manager or the Organizing Committee.
- 2. 'Salute' markers, such as clocks, may be moved at any time during the competition and riders should stay alert to the Gate person's instructions.
- 3. The Competitions Manager may determine to pre-load or not pre-load at any time during the competition—this same procedure is used when competitions are televised.
- 4. Coaches, riders, trainers, and grooms who enter the Competitive Ring must look **NEAT AND BE SUITABLY ATTIRED** in the opinion of the Hitching Ring Officials. (FEI Article 256.1.2)
- 5. ONLY RIDERS ENTERED IN THE SPECIFIC COMPETITION AND THEIR COACH OR TRAINER MAY WALK THE COURSE. <u>NO DOGS</u> <u>ARE PERMITTED ON THE RING.</u>
- 6. Horses wearing coolers are not allowed in the Competitive Ring unless authorized.
- 7. Competition scoring may change from what is printed based on a number of factors including but not limited to number of entries and weather conditions.
- 8. Persons are only allowed in the Competitive Ring when competing or when the course is clearly marked 'OPEN'.

PRESENTATIONS

- 1. Competitors must be mounted when entering the Competitive Ring for presentations.
- 2. Winners of each competition to a maximum of twelve must be present for the competition awards. **PLEASE ANTICIPATE IN ADVANCE THE NEED TO RIDE IN FOR YOUR PRESENTATION ON A WELL-MANNERED HORSE.** Your Cavalier's Salute to the sponsor's representatives during the Victory Gallop is your way of thanking them. Failure to appear for presentations will result in forfeiture of prize monies won.
- 3. Participation in parades and special awards for requested winners/FEI riders is mandatory for all FEI Riders. Please plan accordingly. Parade horses are not available through Spruce Meadows.
- 4. Winners of championships and/or other awards must be present for the Award Presentations. Competitors who do not comply will forfeit their prizes.
- 5. No helmet cameras of any kind are permitted to be worn.



FALLS, ACCIDENTS & RETURN TO PLAY

In the event a concussion is reasonably suspected, a competitor must receive medical clearance from the medical personnel on duty before being allowed to return to competition. It is up to the competitor to receive said clearance. Refusal to be evaluated by the medical personnel on-site will lead to disqualification from the Tournament. Fees will not be refunded in such cases. Please see Equestrian Canada Article A101 for further details.

In the event of a fall by a horse or rider anywhere on Spruce Meadows property, they must be cleared by medical personnel/ veterinarian prior to competition. (FEI Article 224)

ORDER OF GO

- The Order of Go will be drawn for the first day. Thereafter the order will be by rotational draw unless otherwise specified. The order will be posted in the Tournament Offices and on the Spruce Meadows website (www.sprucemeadows.com) after 10:00 P.M. the day before each competition is held.
- 2. FEI Article 252.2 will apply for competitors going consecutively in the same competition.
- 3. Special or unforeseen circumstances will be dealt with by the Organizing Committee or Ground Jury on a case-by-case basis.
- If a rider has two horses in a jump-off, the rider will have the option of moving up in the order or be prepared to go back into the ring without a warm-up for the second horse.
- 5. In competitions with Immediate Jump-Offs, FEI Article 245.3 will apply.
- 6. COMPETITORS WHO HAVE MISSED THEIR COMPETITION WILL NOT BE REFUNDED.

TIES

All ties in jumper competitions will be broken on the basis of time in accordance with FEI Rules. In consultation and agreement with the Ground Jury and Organizing Committee, ties will be broken in any jump-off on the basis of time to 100ths of a second. Competitions under Table A, Article 238.2.1 One Round: should there be equality of faults and time after the first round for first place only, there will be one jump-off against the clock.

RIDER'S MEETINGS

Rider's meetings, chaired by the President of Spruce Meadows and attended by the Competitions Manager, Tournament Secretary, Stewards, FEI Vet Delegate, and Press Officer are held on an as needed basis. Notable rules, issues and Spruce Meadows' method of operating are reviewed followed by a question and answer period. **We STRONGLY recommend attendance by all competitors.**

PROTESTS

Protests shall be handled in accordance to FEI rules. Feel free to bring your unofficial concerns to the Competitions Manager for consideration.

PRIZE MONEY

All prize money will be paid in CANADIAN FUNDS. Prize money is paid by cheque drawn to the order of the rider/owner **as**

indicated on the entry form and will be paid out following your last competition when the account is closed. Cheques can only be made when there is a credit balance on any given horse account. There is a \$25 fee for all outgoing wires

Please note that Championship awards will be paid directly to the horse account or the rider, and cannot be paid until after the last competition on Sunday, when the account can then be closed.

PLEASE REVIEW INSTRUCTIONS ON THE ENTRY FORM AND COMPLETE ALL INFORMATION TO ALLOW US TO PROCESS CHEQUES CORRECTLY. WE ARE UNABLE TO ADJUST TO WHOM THE PRIZE MONEY IS PAID AFTER THE START OF THE TOURNAMENT.

WITHHOLDING TAX & FOREIGN OWNERSHIP

The Revenue Canada Tax Department requires that in the payment of funds to non-resident competitors and/or horses owned (in whole or in part) by non-residents of Canada, 15% of each payment must be withheld and submitted to the Tax Department. A T4A-NR form will be mailed from Spruce Meadows by February 28, 2025 so that it can be included in your 2024 Canadian tax return.

Ownership information listed in the passport or registration (and therefore registered with the appropriate Federation) is considered correct. If there are any issues with, or corrections to, the address/ownership shown in your horse's passport, you must bring these to the attention of the Tournament Secretary for a ruling by the Organizing Committee before the start of the Tour to exempt you from Withholding Tax.

CLOSING YOUR ACCOUNTS

After your horse's final competition, please come to the North Meadows Tournament Office to close your account. If you are using a different card (debit or credit) than listed on the entry form, please bring it with you at the time of close out. Once your account has been closed, you will receive your horse passport/ security release form. Any outstanding accounts must be cleared within 2 days of the end of the Tour-failure to close your accounts in a timely manner may impact your ability to enter future Tournaments. Accounts not closed within two days of the end of the Tournament will be assessed a fine of \$100 and will be closed using the form of payment on the original entry. By closing your account you or your agent/representative are confirming the accuracy of said account. We regret no further adjustments can be made. Failure to close your accounts in a timely manner will impact your acceptance into future tournaments.

All financial matters pertaining to the North Star Tour 1 will be closed by June 21. All financial matters pertaining to the North Star Tour 2 will be closed by July 11, 2024.

ORGANIZING COMMITTEE DECISIONS

1. IT IS IMPORTANT TO UNDERSTAND THAT INTERPRETATIONS OF EXISTING RULES AND REGULATIONS AND THE INVOKING OF ADDITIONAL RULES AND REGULATIONS TO COVER UNFORESEEN CIRCUMSTANCES ARE THE SOLE RESPONSIBILITY AND AUTHORITY OF THE ORGANIZING COMMITTEE, AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE GROUND JURY. ALL OWNERS, TRAINERS, COMPETITORS AND GROOMS AGREE TO THE ACCEPTANCE OF THESE INTERPRETATIONS AND ADDITIONAL RULINGS BY VIRTUE OF YOUR SIGNED ENTRY.



- It is the objective of the Organizing Committee to run the Spruce Meadows Tournaments at the highest possible level of sportsmanship. Judges, Course Designers, and Technical Delegates have been selected by the FEI and the Organizing Committee based on their knowledge and experience. Their decisions with respect to the competitions are their own responsibility.
- 3. The Organizing Committee reserves the right to hold a qualifying round for any competition where the number of horses entered is excessive. In the unlikely event that a competition has less than 15 horses entered, the competition may be cancelled and start fees refunded.
- 4. Competitions may be split or phased at the discretion of the Organizing Committee.
- 5. The Steward(s) and those designated as Assistant Stewards (complete listing available on request from the Tournament Secretary) shall have full power to act for and on behalf of the Organizing Committee during the Tournament. The Organizing Committee is not bound by opinions of its Staff, such as Veterinary Doctors, Tournament Office and Field Staff, in the interpretation of these rules. In the International Divisions, the Stewards must consult with the Ground Jury in case of infractions before submitting to the Organizing Committee.
- 6. Spruce Meadows is dedicated to the historical traditions of show jumping with turf and natural obstacles. Please be advised that these obstacles can be used at the discretion of the course designers in any of the competitions.

EXCUSING OR DISQUALIFYING

- Any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges, officials, volunteers, or staff, as determined by the Organizing Committee, may result in disqualification. Such unacceptable behaviour may result in forfeiture of Tournament fees paid and prize money, and acceptance in future Tournaments may be determined by the Organizing Committee.
- 2. The Organizing Committee reserves the right to remove any groom, trainer, rider, parent, manager or owner or ALL of a related group from the Tournament without being liable for compensation.
- 3. Inhumane treatment of a horse on the grounds is forbidden and, if a violation occurs, the Organizing Committee along with the Ground Jury or Appeal Committee for the International Division, has the right to disqualify the Competitor from the Tournament. Such unacceptable treatment will result in forfeiture of Tournament fees paid and any prize money won, and acceptance in future Tournaments will be determined by the Organizing Committee. Refer to Welfare of the Horse, Code of Conduct, Ethic Committee, FEI Nov. 1990.
- 4. Judges have the discretion to eliminate a competitor after a sufficient number of penalties have been incurred which prevent the athlete from qualifying for the final placings.
- 5. Horse numbers must be worn by horses at all times when outside of their assigned stall. The use of a wrong number or having no number may result in disqualification from the competition or tournament, and a \$100 fine.

6. In the case of a horse(s) being disqualified, the winner of the next succeeding prize shall take the prize that had been awarded to the disqualified horse(s) and the other prizes will be adjusted accordingly.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Spruce Meadows is committed to the highest of standards of behaviour and the sport of show jumping and expects the same standards, conduct and behaviour from its athletes and their associates.

Disrespect of these standards towards the Spruce Meadows employees, officials, volunteers, paramedics, or athletes will not be tolerated and may result in the disqualification of horse and rider; all prize money won and monies paid will be forfeited. There will be no appeals on these types of Organizing Committee/Ground Jury decisions.

In the event medical care is required by an individual on Spruce Meadows property, the Paramedics on site have been contracted and authorized by Spruce Meadows Ltd to provide immediate care and have the authority to make decisions in this capacity, including but not limited to: level of care and transportation method to the appropriate treatment facility, should it be deemed necessary.

NOTE CAREFULLY: Extremes of dress and social behaviour on the part of athletes, trainers, owners, or associates are not welcome at Spruce Meadows. At its sole discretion, the Organizing Committee will insist on such individuals leaving the Tournament grounds. Your enthusiasm for high personal standards and adoption of the highest of standards can be your real and meaningful way of supporting and saying thank you to Spruce Meadows.

Wilful damage of property is strictly prohibited and grounds for expulsion from the facility.

All the people of Spruce Meadows; our professional staff, officials, technicians, our sponsors, the media, and our fans are dedicated to you and will make every effort to ensure safe, quality competitions and facilities.

Spruce Meadows reserves the right to suspend or permanently remove any individual from the grounds for a single egregious act or for escalating behaviours that are contradictory to the Spruce Meadows Code of Conduct. BY ENTERING THE TOURNAMENT YOU ARE ACCEPTING ALL THE RULES AND REGULATIONS INCLUDING THE CODE OF CONDUCT.

RECOGNITION OF MEDIA, INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY AND SPONSORSHIP RIGHTS

All riders, owners and related associates grant to Spruce Meadows the irrevocable, perpetual and unrestricted rights to take, record, modify, publish, license, sell, assign, and use photographic images and audio and audio-visual recordings of themselves, their horse(s), their competitive performance(s) and practice(s), while on or near Spruce Meadows property; this includes, without limitation, uses which are for commercial, non-commercial, training, public-interest or other purposes, and images or recordings whether alone or in compilation with other materials, edited or enhanced, cropped or otherwise altered, and whether by Spruce Meadows or its agents, representatives, associates, licensees, or assignees.



All riders, owners and related associates acknowledge and agree not to contest that copyright and every such image and recording is the property of Spruce Meadows (or those claiming under Spruce Meadows, as the case may be). All riders, owners and related associates consent to the behaviours associated with the exercise of the rights detailed above and acknowledge that they are not alone a violation of any right of privacy or protection of personal information.

Riders, owners and all related associates may wish to utilize a variety of audio-video recording equipment on their horse(s), equipment or tack, helmets, or persons in order to take video or still recordings of their competitive rides. There is concern that such equipment may alter the performance of safety equipment or pose a safety problem for rider or horse, or may interfere with the operation of timing and communications equipment and systems associated with running Events.

In addition, the equipment may not be suitable for accepted federation dress or equipment codes or rider or horse appearance or welfare when in competition. Further, its use may be in breach of existing licensing, commercial and or sponsorship arrangements. Spruce Meadows reserves the right to require any rider to remove such equipment prior to permitting that rider to enter a competition ring or practice ring, and by seeking to enter a tournament or practice ring, you agree to this restriction.

Spruce Meadows recognizes that personal recording of videos takes place on Spruce Meadows property during and around Events, and generally speaking, allows such recordings to take place for personal, non commercial use. It is also recognized that individuals, for personal and non-commercial purposes, may wish to post or share their videos on the internet and in other social media, which is permissible under certain terms and conditions.

For clarity, and for the avoidance of doubt, the rider, owner or appointed representative agrees not to transmit, or facilitate transmission, of any account, description, picture, or reproduction of any Spruce Meadows event in violation of licensing, sponsorship, Federation or Code of Conduct rules and regulations.

LIABILITY

FORCE MAJEURE

Spruce Meadows shall not be liable for any damages or loss or otherwise for any variation, cancellation or postponement of any tournament or event, in whole or in part, caused directly or indirectly by or in consequence of any force majeure event including fire, storm, dangerous weather condition, war, insurrection, riot, civil commotion, strike, epidemic, pandemic, or by any other cause whatsoever beyond the control of Spruce Meadows whether similar to or dissimilar from the causes enumerated herein.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK

The competitor understands that all equestrian sports involve inherent risks and dangers including risk of serious personal injury, damage, harm, loss, pain and suffering, permanent disability or even death. Such risks may result from the competitor's actions or omissions, the actions or omissions of others, environmental conditions, the condition of the premises, or by the inherent hazards of the events the competitor is participating in. The competitor agrees to immediately discontinue any activity if the competitor believes at any time that the conditions are unsafe.

The competitor fully understands and assumes these risks and dangers and accepts sole responsibility for any personal or property injury, damage, harm, loss, pain or suffering or even death. The competitor further affirms that (s)he is physically and mentally capable of participating in the events chosen.

WAIVER OF LIABILITY AND INDEMNIFICATION

Spruce Meadows assumes no responsibility whatsoever for any personal property, including animals, brought or placed on the premises and the owner and competitor agree that Spruce Meadows is expressly released and discharged from any and all liability from any loss or damage relating to such property.

The owner and competitor agree, jointly and severally, to hold harmless, release and discharge Spruce Meadows from all liability and waive all claims, demands and actions against Spruce Meadows and each of its directors, officers, employees, agents, representatives and volunteers, for all personal or property injury, damage, harm, loss or costs whatsoever (including as may arise from the negligence of Spruce Meadows or any of its directors, officers, employees, agents, representatives or volunteers) which is sustained by the owner, the competitor or any of their employees, agents, representatives, or assigns while on the premises or relating in any way to the participation of the owner or competitor in this tournament, including transportation to and from the tournament.

The owner and competitor are jointly and severally responsible for all injury, damage, harm, loss or cost to any third party caused by the owner, competitor, or any of their employees, agents, representatives, assigns, or any of their horses or other animals brought on the premises. The owner and competitor assume full liability for and shall fully defend, indemnify (including payment of all legal fees, costs and disbursements) and hold harmless Spruce Meadows and each of its directors, officers, employees, agents, representatives and volunteers, from all claims, demands and actions brought by any person which is in any way caused by the owner, the competitor or any of their employees, agents, representatives or assigns, or any of their horses or other animals.

The owner and competitor are required to secure third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep that policy updated.

PHOTOGRAPHIC/VIDEO IMAGE RELEASE.

The competitor understands that Spruce Meadows will be gathering photographic and video images and recordings during this event, which images and recordings may include the competitor. The competitor agrees that those images and recordings are the sole and exclusive property of Spruce Meadows and hereby consent to Spruce Meadow's release and reproduction of all photographic and video images, recordings and likenesses taken during its events for future promotional or commercial purposes, without any notice or compensation to the competitor.

CONSENT TO RECEIVE MEDICAL CARE

The competitor hereby consents to receive any medical care and treatment that may be deemed advisable in the event the competitor sustains an injury or illness while participating in the tournament. The competitor authorizes and voluntarily consents to the release and disclosure of personal health information by a physician, hospital, emergency medical technical or Spruce Meadows for the purposes of diagnosing or providing treatment, for payment of any medical care or treatment, or for coordination of care. The competitor understands and agrees that (s)he is solely responsible for and will assume liability for

all costs for medical care and treatment and will indemnify and hold harmless Spruce Meadows from all liability for such costs

It is the responsibility of the competitor to complete and/ or submit any EC/FEI/WADA medical treatment/exemption paperwork if/as required due to treatment.

BORDER CROSSING / INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

Spruce Meadows advises all International competitors, especially those trucking, to check with the relevant border authorities (i.e. Canadian Border Services and the Canadian Food Inspection Agency) prior to arrival at the Canadian border. Customs requires that all horses possess a health certificate issued by the official government veterinarian of the country of origin and have an import permit for entry into Canada. Conditions for entry of horses to Canada are as per Canadian Government Health Regulations.

All horses are required by Canadian Food Inspection Agency to have an import permit issued by the Minister of Agriculture of Canada (www.inspection.gc.ca).

Please call the Canadian Food Inspection Agency at (587) 230-2468 or Dr. Kelley at 403.344.3808 for more information.

Commercial carriers entering Canada are advised to be aware of the eManifest requirements prior to arriving at the border. Information regarding the eManifest can be found on the CBSA website (http://www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca/prog/manif/menu-eng. html). Please contact CBSA directly with any questions pertaining to the eManifest. Many travellers to Canada now require an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) to enter Canada. Please check the Government of Canada website (http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/ visit/eta.asp) for details and to apply. This is generally a quick process, however please DO NOT leave this until the last minute as Spruce Meadows is unable to assist with late applications.



Please email or call **well in advance** (<u>not the night before</u>) of your departure to request an appointment.

Horses travelling to the USA within 60 days of arriving from Europe may require additional testing and paperwork to cross the US border. Please plan accordingly.

There is no permanent or returning import quarantine available at Spruce Meadows. Limited temporary import quarantine may be available. You must inform Spruce Meadows by April 26 (May 3 if you are using OHS) if you are considering temporary import. Any horse coming in on a temporary import permit MUST be eligible to stable in FEI, and must return directly to it's country of origin or to another venue as listed on the import permit Temporary import horses from Europe must arrive on June 3, June 17 or June 24..

Export blood is not permitted to be drawn at Spruce Meadows. Please take that in to consideration when making your travel plans.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

- The Spruce Meadows 'National', 'Continental', 'Pan American', 'North American' & 'Masters' Tournaments are official International Events which have been authorized by the Fédération Equestre Internationale and will be conducted in accordance with the current FEI statues, rules, and regulations. The horse show grounds are govered by the laws of Canada.
- 2. Protests shall be handled according to FEI protocols.
- 3. The Revenue Canada Tax Department requires that in the payment of funds to non-resident competitors and/ or horses owned (in whole or in part) by non-residents of Canada, 15% of each payment must be withheld and submitted to the Tax Department. A T4A-NR form will be mailed from Spruce Meadows by February 28, 2025 so that it can be included in your 2024 Canadian tax return.
- 4. Ownership information listed in the passport (and therefore registered with the appropriate Federation) is considered correct. If there are any issues with, or corrections to, the address/ownership shown in your horse's passport, you must bring these to the attention of the Tournament Office for a ruling by the Organizing Committee by the start of the Tour to exempt you from Withholding Tax.
- 5. In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Ground Jury, the Organizing Committee reserves the right to modify the Tournament Schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes will be communicated as soon as possible and they will be reported to the FEI.
- Participation in parades and special awards on the Saturday and Sunday of the 'National', 'North American' & 'Masters' tournaments is mandatory for all FEI Riders. Please plan accordingly. Parade horses are not available through Spruce Meadows.

- 7. Competitors are responsible to the Ground Jury on entering the competitive ring.
- 8. Horses may only jump/declare once per day.
- 9. Horses dropping out of FEI after the definite date and still attending the tournament will be charged the \$850 FEI fee in addition to any applicable tournament fees (e.g. stabling, nominations, late fees).

FEI FEES FOR HORSES & RIDERS

All horses and riders must be registered with the FEI, and entered in the FEI entry system by the definite dates to be accepted in to the tournaments. Late entries may not be accepted.





EQUINE INFLUENZA

All horses participating in FEI events must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza, according to the following minimum protocol (FEI Veterinary Regulations Article 1003). It is requested horses also be vaccinated for EHV within the last 6 months. If an FEI competition horse does not proof of EHV vaccination, their movements throughout the grounds will be limited, and there will be no option for them to drop out of FEI and compete nationally.

GRAND PRIX QUALIFICATIONS

The Pre-Qualified Riders List for Grand Prix Competitions can be obtained from the FEI.

SAMPLING OF PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

Sampling will take place according to EADCMR and FEI rules.

EQUINE ANTI-DOPING & CONTROLLED MEDICATION REGULATIONS

ALL HORSES ARE SUBJECT TO DRUG TESTING AND ALL COMPETITORS AGREE THAT BY MAKING THEIR ENTRY THEY WILL ALLOW THEIR HORSES TO BE SO TESTED.

As per EC, an equine drug testing fee of \$49.00 per horse per tournament will be charged

HUMAN DOPING CONTROL

All competitors are subject to drug testing and all competitors agree that by making their entries they will allow themselves to be so tested. The Testing Program will be carried out by the World Anti-Doping Agency (W.A.D.A.) in accordance with the agreements between the FEI and W.A.D.A., and FEI General Rules & Regulations. At Spruce Meadows all drugs deemed to be prohibited under FEI rules will not be tolerated. **These regulations will be vigorously enforced.**

Situations where competitors, or others connected with the competitors, are found on the Tournament grounds to be suspected of criminal activities or in possession of illegal substances, as defined by the Criminal Code of Canada, will be reported to the appropriate law enforcement authorities.

EXERCISE AREA & HITCHING RING RULES

SPRUCE MEADOWS APPLIES THE FEI RULES— FOR ALL COMPETITIONS IN ALL RINGS AT ALL TOURNAMENTS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR. This has been agreed upon in cooperation with Equestrian Canada. The list of allowed fences is available in the tournament office. Please see article 242. The fences provided may be jumped only in the direction flagged. No part of the practice obstacles may be held by anyone. The obstacles in the hitching ring may not exceed 1.80m in width and 1.65m in height.

UNAUTHORIZED SCHOOLING MAY, AT THE DISCRETION OF THE GROUND JURY, RESULT IN FORFEITURE OF TOURNAMENT FEES PAID AND PRIZE MONEY FOR ALL ENTRIES OF THE OWNER, TRAINER, COMPETITOR, GROOMS AND GROUP INVOLVED. ACCEPTANCE IN FUTURE TOURNAMENTS WILL BE DETERMINED BY THE ORGANIZING COMMITTEE, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE CSIO TEAM MEMBERS.

ONCE HORSES ARE IN THE FEI HITCHING RING AREA FOR ANY GIVEN FEI COMPETITION, THEY MAY NOT LEAVE AND RETURN FOR THE COMPETITION WITHOUT THE CONSENT OF THE STEWARDS ON DUTY.

NOMINATIONS - EQUESTRIAN CANADA DIVISIONS

- Competitors have until 4:00 P.M. the day before the Tournament's FEI Jog to adjust their nominations. You will be charged a \$150 late fee, in addition to the nomination fee, for any new divisions added after this deadline and nomination fees will NOT be refunded if you decide not to compete AFTER this deadline.
- 2. Competitors may only adjust their nominations within 2 divisions (up or down) of what is indicated on the entry form.

BIRTH DATE

- 1. Riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of January 1st of the current year, are classified as JUNIORS.
- 2. All Juniors must state their birth date on the entry form, and birth certificates are to be made available upon request
- 3. ALL AMERICAN RIDERS MUST HAVE AN EC MEMBERSHIP AND HAVE COMPLETED THE MANDATORY SAFE SPORT TRAINING TO BE ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE. There is no cost to the membership providing you are a current member in good standing with USEF.

HORSE REGISTRATION

- A current EQUESTRIAN CANADA Horse Registration is mandatory for all Canadian-owned horses / ponies. Foreign-owned horses should have a passport issued by the FEI, or provide written certification of eligibility (Affidavit) at the Tournament Office upon arrival.
- 2. By signing the entry form, competitors, parents, persons responsible are testifying that the entry is eligible for the competitions entered. Subsequent determination that such is not the case will result in elimination.
- 3. Proof of current Horse Registration, temporary Horse Registration or a completed affidavit must be turned in to the Tournament Office before the horse will be allowed to compete.

DRUG INSPECTION

- 1. All competitors and all horses are subject to drug testing. All competitors agree that by making their entry they will allow themselves and their horses to be so tested.
- 2. Any horse entered in any competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location (as per article A602.5).

3. Competitors will be assessed a drug fee of \$8 CDN per horse per tournament.

EXERCISE AREA & HITCHING RING RULES

- 1. Spruce Meadows applies the FEI rules for all competitions in all rings at all tournaments throughout the year. This has been agreed upon in cooperation with Equestrian Canada.
- 2. Unauthorized schooling will result in forfeiture of tournament fees paid and prize money for all entries of the owner, trainer, competitor, groom and group involved. Acceptance in future tournaments will be determined by the Organizing Committee.

JUNIORS RIDING STALLIONS

Juniors aged 16 and above may ride manageable stallions in Jumper competitions. A stallion ridden by a Junior must be accompanied at all times by a competent adult/handler/person responsible. Decisions regarding the manageability of stallions are at the discretion of the judge or steward. Unmanageable stallions must be excused from the ring and/or warm-up ring. (Article G105)

EQUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

- Requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Actively promoting the development and adherence of competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

NATIONAL FEDERATION MEMBERSHIP

- 1. Riders and owners must submit copies of membership cards with their entries.
- 2. Gold level memberships are required for all Canadian riders and owners competing in EC divisions.
- 3. Every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competitions. Do not participate in these EC-sanctioned competitions in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competitions. (As per Article A801).

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

 The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES:

• Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

• Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS:

- All coaches at EC-sanctioned events require EC Licensed Coach Status. For upgrading from Registered to Licensed Status, coaches can apply for a Temporary Coach Status (TCS) to fulfill the requirement for each event.
- New for 2024: A TCS may be purchased conveniently online via the MyEC Portal only. Each TCS is valid for a single event.

EMPOWERING SELF-COACHED ATHLETES:

 Athletes without a designated coach can declare themselves as self-coached by providing their name and EC Sport Licence number on their entry form. **When registering for EC** sanctioned competitions. athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are selfcoached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance.
