






Fort McMurray Disaster Relief

■ The Hub Family Resource Centre



As was the case in Alberta, Canada and even throughout the world, the Spruce Meadows Leg Up Foundation Board of Directors were devastated by the Fort McMurray Fire in 2016. As such, the Spruce Meadows Leg Up Foundation worked hard to raise funds to directly support and assist during the long and difficult road to recovery.

The Hub Family Resource Centre was a natural fit as partner for the Spruce Meadows Leg Up Foundation as it serves the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo (RMWB), offering free programming and resources to families. The program specifically targets children, newborn to 6 years old and their families, living within the RMWB – a particularly vulnerable group after the Fire in 2016.

The MI Kids program aspires to provide barrier-free participation to sport, recreation, social and cultural programs and acitivies in the Wood Buffalo region. Upon realization of the need to focus on these acitivites after the Fort McMurray Fire in 2016, the Spruce Meadows Leg Up Foundation was pleased to partner with the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo to support this wonderful initiative.

■ Big Brothers Big Sisters of Wood Buffalo



The Horse World was one that was greatly affected and often unnoticed during and after the Fort McMurray Fires. The Alberta Equestrian Federation (AEF), which was formed in 1978 as a non-profit to support equestrian sport and recreation, was a strong player in assisting the equine world during the difficult recovery process in Fort McMurray. The donation from the Spruce Meadows Leg Up Foundation to the AEF has gone to assist with the purchase of hay, which is vitally needed by many equines in Fort McMurray.

Autism Aspergers Friendship Society (AAFS) of Calgary



The Autism Aspergers Friendship Society (AAFS) of Calgary has been a welcome partner at Spruce Meadows for several years. They participated in the Spruce Meadows Jumps to Give a Leg Up contest, which involved painting a fiberglass horse and raising donations for the horse, and have been friends of Spruce Meadows ever since. The Spruce Meadows Leg Up Foundation was pleased to work with the AAFS in support of the 50/50 initiative which, in total, raised \$35,964. AAFS used the donated funds from the Spruce Meadows Leg Up Foundation to support Fort McMurray families, and fund their Therapeutic Riding Program (pictured below).

Even Start



For over 18 years, EvenStart has partnered with Heartland Agency & Educational Services to help children recover from the effects of trauma and pursue school and life opportunities on par with those more fortunate. Each year, EvenStart helps approximately 200 children aged three to five in a comprehensive three-year EvenStart program. They provide educational, therapeutic, nutritional and nurturing support aimed at building a strong foundation for healthy physical, emotional and mental well-being. The Spruce Meadows Leg Up Foundation is proud to support this wonderful group, which truly embodies the goal of the Foundation.
